Osmotic Laxatives

Osmotic laxatives are a type of laxatives used for treating constipation. In the intestine, osmotic agents pull water from the surrounding tissues using a process known as osmosis. Excess moisture in the intestine results in softer stools that are easier to pass.

Spasmodic/Stimulant Laxatives

Stimulant laxatives trigger the intestines to contract and push out the stool.

Dulcolax	Bisacodyl	Capsule, suppository, soft chews
Smooth move	Senna, licorice, fennel fruit, ginger	Herbal tea
Senokot	Senna leaf powder extract	Gummy, tablet, tea
Castor oil	Castor oil	Liquid
